



U.S. Air Force Awards \$32 Million SBIR Contract to Melbourne Business
--TRDA Business Innovation Center Client Lands Phase III Award--

(October 5, 2009) — The Technological Research and Development Authority (TRDA) is pleased to announce that Securboration, Inc. was awarded a \$32 million SBIR Phase III extension contract to its Command and Control Ontology-based Semantic Interoperability Framework contract with the U.S. Air Force.
